


Lawn Care for Yardeners

We define a perfect lawn as one that is green all year long, needs fertilizing twice a year in fall and again in spring, hardly ever needs watering except during drought, has no weeds, no insects, and no disease, takes minimum time to maintain, and looks better than any other lawn in the neighborhood. Sound like a fantasy? Not at all. Such a lawn can be had if you follow the advice in this section of Yardener's Helper.

There are four key steps:



Raise the lawnmower height to 2 1/2 inches in the spring and fall and 3 inches in the summer.



Overseed the lawn once or twice this year, and then every three to four years thereafter.



Add organic material to the soil under the turf by mulching at least once a year from now on.



Use only slow release nitrogen fertilizer on the lawn; never the quick release nitrogen fertilizers.
